The Grace of God

For by grace you have been saved through faith; and this is not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; 9 not a result of works, so that no one may boast. (Eph 2:8-9, NASB)

This scripture has been a favorite text of many preachers for years. Perhaps, no verses in the Bible have been quoted more frequently. The object on many occasions has been to prove the fact that there is absolutely nothing man can do for his eternal salvation.

The word "grace" as used in this passage, means just what it does everywhere – unmerited favor. The grace of God is His free and everlasting love and favor. His grace is the source of all the blessings that have been so lovingly bestowed upon man. This free and unmerited love of God is the foundation that sought redemption for mankind. As man rebelled and sinned in the garden of Eden, he forfeited every claim he had to the mercy and love of God. Yet, God still loved His creation. Expressing His love, what could God give more than the life of His Son? John 3:16 reminds us, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." (NKJV) This is grace divine. God did and does for man what man could not do for himself. We read in Roman 5:8, "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (NASB)

Paul, in his letter to Titus (Titus 2:11) says, "For the grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men." (NKJV) Therefore, the question must be asked, "Why, then, are all men not saved?" Peter reminds us, "The Lord is not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance" (2Pet 2:9). Truth is man has a role in this as well. Jesus invites and man must respond. Man must respond with faith (Heb 11:6), with repentance (Ac 2:38, 17:30; & Rom 2:4), with confession (Rom 10:10; & Matt 12:32), and with baptism (Mk 16:16; Ac 2:38, & 22:16); and then living a life of obedience. The Hebrew writer, speaking of Jesus, said, "Although He was a Son, He learned obedience from the things which He suffered. ⁹ And having been perfected, He became the source of eternal salvation for all those who obey Him" (Heb 5:8-9, NASB).

Lest we begin to think we deserve this, we must remember this is all by the grace of God, lest any man should boast. Paul tells us, "But when the kindness of God our Savior and His love for mankind appeared, ⁵ He saved us, not on the basis of deeds which we did in righteousness, but in accordance with His mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit, ⁶ whom He richly poured out upon us through Jesus Christ our Savior, ⁷ so that being justified by His grace we would be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life." (Titus 3:4-7, NASB).

Let me ask: How can you slight this expression of a Father's supreme love? How can you turn your face from the scenes of Calvary when you read: "For God so loved the world" and that Jesus "tasted death for every man?" Although, God truly does love you, there is no salvation for you without obedience on your part. Again, He is the author (source) of eternal salvation for all those obey Him. (Heb 5:9)
