Meditation of God's Word

Extending Grace

Grace is not only to be received by us, but it is also, in a sense, to be extended to others. I say, "in a sense," because our relationship with others is different from God's relationship to us. He is the infinitely superior Judge and moral Governor of the universe. We are all sinners and are on an equal plane with one another. So we cannot exercise grace as God does, but we can relate to one another as those who have received grace and who wish to operate on the principles of grace.

In fact, we will not experience peace with God and the joy of God if we are not willing to extend grace to others. This is the point Jesus makes in His parable of the unmerciful servant in Matt. 18:23-34. He told the story of a man who was forgiven a debt of ten thousand talents (millions of dollars), but who was unwilling to forgive a fellow servant who owed him a hundred denarii (a few dollars). Of course, the unstated truth in the parable is that our debt of sin to God far outweighs the debt others may owe us.

The person who is living by grace sees this vast contrast between his own sins against God and the offenses of others against him. He forgives others because he himself has been so graciously forgiven. He realizes that, by receiving God's forgiveness through Christ, he has forfeited the right to be offended when hurt. He practices Paul's admonition in Ephesians 4:32, "Be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you." (NASB)

The thought behind Paul's admonition is the fact that God's unmerited favor has been show to people who are totally undeserving of it, which applies to you, not only in salvation, but in everyday life. This meaning of grace never changes. The fact that God deals with His children on the basis of grace without regard to merit is a staggering concept. However, it is something we need to consider as we relate to others and extend grace to them.

There is a song in our books that says, "God forgave my sin in Jesus' name, I've been born again in Jesus' name. And in Jesus' name, I come to you to share His love as He told me to. He said, 'Freely, freely, you have received, freely, freely give. Go in my name, and because you believe, others will know that I live."

All of that is to say this: Love and forgive others as God has loved and forgiven you – Extend grace.
